*To the Governor of Maryland:*

The following Report is submitted in compliance with the requirements of the Act of Assembly of 1852, chapter 56, sec. 1, and exhibits a complete statement of the funds and revenues of the State, and of the public expenditures during the fiscal year ending on the 30th September, 1858; specifies the amounts derivable and received from each source of revenue, and the purpose for which each expenditure was made; and shows the name, residence and official character of the persons from whom any arrearage may be due, with the amount so due from each defaulter.

RECEIPTS.

STATEMENT A, of the Appendix, shows the total receipts into the Treasury during the fiscal year to have been \$1,019,228.95.

There remained in the Treasury on the 30th of September, 1857, \$718,477.32, which added to the receipts of the year make an aggregate in the Treasury for the fiscal year of \$1,737,706.27.

By an examination of Statement A, of the Appendix, it will appear that of the receipts in 1858, the sum of \$846,031.39 was received for revenue which accrued in that year, and \$173,197.56 was received on account of former years.

A comparison of the total receipts in the fiscal year 1858, with those of the preceding year, shows an excess in favor of 1857 to the amount of \$365,476 45; but the sum of \$275,...
