To the Honorable, the General Assembly of Maryland:

In obedience to the requirements of the provisions of Section 9 of Article 19 of the Code of Public General Laws, I beg to submit herewith my annual report for the fiscal year ended September 30, 1909.

RECEIPTS.

The gross receipts of the Treasury proper during the fiscal year were \$5,400,104.69, an itemized statement of which is shown in Statement "A," to which must be added the balance on hand October 1, 1908, of \$1,238,652.40, aggregating \$6,638,757.09. The receipts proper, however, of \$5,400,104.69, while less in some respects, yet show an increase in the aggregate over the receipts of the year previous of \$886,849.62, mainly from the following sources, viz: High Liquor Licenses from Baltimore City, \$275,972.09; State Roads Loan, \$540,780.00; Collateral Inheritance Tax, \$146,210.85, aggregating \$962,962.94.
