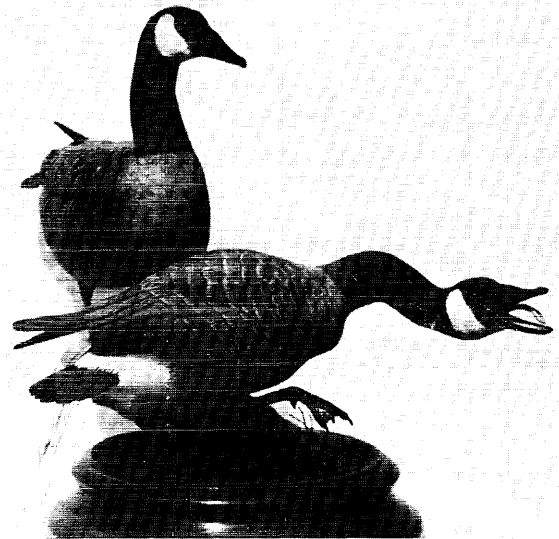


Baltimore Spice
