1. Every sheriff elected shall, within thirty days after his commission has been received by the clerk of his county or of the superior court of Baltimore city, make the declaration of religious belief required by the constitution and also take the oath therein prescribed before such clerk.

He shall also, before he acts as such, give bond to the State of Maryland in the penalty of twenty-five thousand dollars, with security, to be approved by the two judges of the orphans' court or a judge of the circuit court for his county, if he be elected for a county, or by two judges of the orphans' court of Baltimore city, or a judge of the superior court of Baltimore city, if he be elected for said city, with condition that he shall well and faithfully execute the office of sheriff of county or the city of Baltimore, in all things appertaining thereto, and shall well and truly perform all the duties required by law to be by him performed; provided, that the sheriffs elected for Somerset, Harford, Calvert, Howard, Carroll, St. Mary's, Dorchester, Anne Arundel, Queen Anne's, Wicomico, Garrett, Worcester, Montgomery, Kent, Baltimore and Caroline counties shall be required to give bond in the penalty of ten thousand dollars, and for no greater sum.
