2. The county commissioners of each county shall, on or before the first day of May in each year, appoint some person or keeper of standards of weights and measures, who shall safely keep and preserve the same, and, when required, deliver them to the county commissioners, or to such persons as they may appoint to receive the same, and who shall perform the several duties prescribed by this article.
