As the special auditor to whom a case has been referred was fully authorized by this and the following sections to conduct an investigation looking to an accounting by the trustee, including the examination of witnesses and the enforcement of the production of documentary evidence, and as the right of the petitioner and others interested to have such action is similarly secured, and not questioned, an order of court to accomplish such object is superfluous. *Morris v. *The act of 1917, chapter 22, provides for suspension or stay, during the world war, of civil proceedings at law or in equity instituted by or against persons in the national guard or naval militia, or in the Maryland state guard, while in active service, or in the military or naval service of the United States.

The act of 1917, chapter 23, provides for the suspension or stay, during the world war, of any judgment, order or decree, levy, right of entry or foreclosure, lien, power of sale, forfeiture or default, on application of persons against whom or against whose property interests the same may be executed or enforced, and who are unable, by reason of military or naval service, to pay or satisfy the same.
