

## ELECTIONS.

**140.** It shall not be lawful for any person in Calvert County to carry, on the days of election and primary election, within three hundred yards of the polls, secretly or otherwise, any gun, pistol, dirk, dirk-knife, razor, billy or bludgeon; and any person violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof by the Circuit Court for Calvert County, or before any justice of the peace in said county, shall be fined not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars for each offense, and on refusal or failure to pay said fine, shall be committed to the jail of the county until the same is paid.

**141.** The fines collected under the preceding section shall be paid by the officer collecting the same to the School Commissioners of the county for school purposes.

**142.** Any constable of said county, or the sheriff thereof, who shall refuse to arrest any person violating Section 140, upon information of such offense, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof before the Circuit Court for Calvert County, shall be fined not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars, and shall, in the discretion of the court, be discharged from office.

**143.** All judges and clerks of election, appointed according to law by the supervisors of election of Talbot and Calvert Counties are hereby authorized to qualify for their duties and take the oath of office required by law before any justice of the peace in said counties, who are hereby duly authorized to administer such oaths to said judges and clerks of election, and to certify to the same. And upon such qualification before such justices of the peace in said Talbot and Calvert Counties, said judges and clerks of election are hereby authorized to enter upon and perform the duties of their respective offices according to law.

**144.** All owners and proprietors of lands in Calvert County who may have such lands lying contiguous to or adjoining other lands belonging to different owners or proprietors, shall make and keep in repair division fences to bound and enclose said lands at their joint expense, unless said lands are not cultivated and have been used as general outlets or commons.
