**611.** The citizens of Leitersburg, in Washington county, are a body corporate by the name of "The Burgess and Commissioners of Leitersburg," and by that name may sue and be sued, and may have and use a common seal.

**612.** The bounds of the town of Leitersburg shall be as follows: Commencing at a poplar tree, on the road leading from Leitersburg to Smithsburg, near a stable belonging to Jeremiah Slick; thence running with a straight line to a stable near the house occupied by Daniel Lawmanson in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-three; thence with a straight line to a spring on or near a lot belonging to Nathan McDowell, on the road leading from Leitersburg to Green Castle; thence with a straight line to a blacksmith shop occupied by G. W. Lantz in said year, belonging to George Poe; thence with a straight line to the beginning.

**613.** The male citizens of Leitersburg, of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, who have resided twelve months in said town next preceding the election, shall elect by ballot, on the first Monday in April in each year, a burgess, assistant burgess and three commissioners, of the age of not less than twenty-one years, who shall have resided in said town twelve months next preceding the election.

**614.** All elections shall be held and conducted as shall, from time to time, be directed by the by-laws of the corporation, not inconsistent with this charter.

**615.** At all elections for burgess, assistant burgess and commissioners, the persons who shall receive the highest number of votes for the respective offices shall be declared duly elected, and shall qualify as such before a justice of the peace of the county, by making oath that they will dis-
