

CHAPTER 217.

CHAP. 217.

A further supplement to an act, entitled, an act to Incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company. Passed Mar. 17, 1835

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Respecting process
 process shall hereafter be issued under and by virtue of an act of Assembly, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and thirty three, chapter one hundred and sixty-three, only upon the complaint, and at the request, in writing, of an officer or agent of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, and that all fines that may be recovered in such cases, shall accrue wholly to said Company, and that any suit, fine, and the costs incurred, may be remitted in whole or part, by the justice of the peace by whom such process shall have been issued, within one month after the date of his original decision.

CHAPTER 218.

An act to divorce Sarah Postell, of Baltimore City, from her husband, George A. Postell. Passed Mar. 18, 1835

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Divorce
 Sarah Postell be, and she is hereby divorced from her husband George A. Postell, and the marriage heretofore had and solemnized between them, is hereby declared to be null and void, and the said parties are hereby divorced, a vinculo matrimonii.

CHAPTER 219.

An act to alter and amend the Constitution.

Passed Mar. 17, 1835

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* Lottery grants, &c forbid
 after the expiration of existing lottery grants, the Legislature of Maryland shall not pass any law authorising the drawing of any lottery, or the traffick or dealing in lottery tickets, or schemes or devices in the nature of lotteries, or the distribution of money or property by chance.
