

REFERENCE TO THE RESOLUTIONS OF THE SESSION OF 1865.

No. 1. Joint Resolution to authorize and direct the State Librarian to purchase the first and second volumes of the Supplement to the Code for distribution among the Justices of the Peace of the State.

No. 2. Relating to restoring the Naval Academy to Annapolis.

No. 3. Authorizing the State Librarian to subscribe for two hundred and fifty copies of the Digest of the Decisions construing the Statutes of Maryland, by Charles F. Mayer and Lewis Mayer.

No. 4. In reference to the death of Hon. Edward Everett.

No. 5. Ratifying an amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America, proposed by Congress, to the Legislatures of the several States, abolishing Slavery.

No. 6. Requesting our Senators and Representatives in Congress, to use their utmost endeavors to prevent the passage of a law imposing a tax on leaf tobacco. (II. Supplement, Reso. No. 1.)

No. 7. In reference to the pay of Committees of the Senate and House of Delegates, during their absence from the regular sessions. (II. Supplement, Reso. No. 9)

No. 8. Authorizing the State Librarian to subscribe for two hundred copies of the collection of the English Statutes in force in Maryland, as reported by the late Chancellor Kilty, and arranged and annotated by Julian J. Alexander.

No. 9. Authorizing the Librarian to subscribe for two hundred and fifty copies of Cohen and Lee's Digest of the Decisions of the Court of Appeals.

No. 10. Protest to Congress against granting a charter to make a Railroad through Maryland.

No. 11. Abolishing the sixth section of the eighth article of the Constitution, relating to the School Fund.

No. 12. Relating to commission to Hon. John A. J. Creswell, as United States Senator.
