- 1862, c. 234, amending act of 1852, c. 302, to provide for the erection of an hospital for the insane in this state.
- 1864, c. 248, an act for the government of the insane asylum, and to regulate admissions thereto.
- 1864, c. 218, an act to provide for the completion of the hospital for the insane in this state, and for its speedy occupation.
- 1865, c. 139, appropriates fifteen thousand dollars for the relief of the Maryland hospital.
- 1868, c. 117, repeals act of 1862, c. 234; and ss. 4, 5, 6 and 8, of 1864, c. 248, and enacts in lieu thereof.
- 1868, c. 264, an act to authorize the commissioners of the insane hospital at Catonsville to receive inebriates as patients until the hospital for inebriates shall be completed.
- 1868, c. 275, appointing Dr. Francis M. Simons a visitor of the Maryland hospital for Wicomico county.
- 1870, c. 65, incorporating the Mount Hope retreat, in Baltimore county.
- 1870, c. 208, providing for the sale of the property of the president and visitors of the Maryland hospital; and for the removal of said hospital to Spring Grove, in Baltimore county; and for the transfer of said Spring Grove property to said president and visitors.
- 1872, c. 236, creates a loan to provide for the completion and furnishing of the buildings for the Maryland hospital at Spring Grove, in Baltimore county.
- 1867, c. 170, amending the act incorporating the Washington university of Baltimore; and providing for the establishment of an hospital to be styled the Maryland free hospital, in said city.
