Each register shall diligently attend each meeting of the orphans' court in his county or city, and under their direction make full and fair entries of their proceedings, and also make a fair record in a strong bound book or books, of all wills proved before him or the said court, or authenticated according to law, and of all other matters by law directed to be recorded in the said court or in his office; he shall make out and issue every summons, process, or order of the court, and shall in every respect act under their control and direction as the clerk of a court of law is under the direction of such court of law; and he shall give out and certify under the seal of the court any copy of any part of the proceedings in the court or in his office which any person may demand, and he shall be entitled to payment for any service done by him according to the table of fees now or hereafter settled by law.
