

the full power and authority to make all needful rules and regulations therefor, which rules and regulations shall have the force of law.

3. At all times the commander-in-chief is hereby authorized to make and publish all needful rules and regulations for the control, discipline, armament and equipment of the militia to carry out the provisions of this article, which rules and regulations shall, as far as practicable, conform to the laws and regulations governing the organization of the United States volunteer forces, their discipline, armament, equipment and officers, and which rules and regulations shall have the force of law.

4. Whenever the commander-in-chief shall deem it necessary he may order an enrolment of all persons, other than members of the national guard, liable to military duty, to be made by persons by him designated. Such enrolment shall state the name, residence, age and occupation of the persons enrolled. Two copies of such enrolment shall be made, one to be filed with the clerk of the superior court of Baltimore city, or with the clerk of the circuit court for the county wherein such enrolment shall be made, the other to be filed in the office of the adjutant general of the State. The officer making such enrolment shall, at the time of making the same, serve a notice of such enrolment upon each person enrolled by delivering such notice to him or by leaving it with some person of suitable age and discretion at his place of residence. All persons claiming exemption must, within fifteen days after the service of such notice as hereinbefore provided for, file a written statement of such exemption, verified by affidavit, in the office of the clerk of the superior court of Baltimore city, or in the office of the clerk of the circuit court for the county, as the case may require; such clerk shall thereupon, if such person be exempt according to law, mark the word "Exempt" opposite his name on the copy of the enrolment in his possession, and forthwith forward to the adjutant general a list of the names of all persons thus marked "Exempt," with the original written statements of such exemption. All persons shall, upon the application of the officer making such enrolment, give the name of, and all other proper information concerning any person within their knowledge liable to be enrolled, under penalty of ten dollars for every concealment or false informa-
