

ges to any husband, wife, parent, employer or other person injured by reason of any person being intoxicated by liquor sold by said vendor, said damages to be ascertained by a justice of the peace for said county, when the sum claimed does not exceed one hundred dollars, if more than one hundred dollars, then, in the same manner as debts for like amounts are now recovered by law.

SUB-SECTION V. Nothing in this act shall be construed to authorize any sale or barter, or giving away of any spirituous or fermented liquor or lager beer on the Sabbath day, commonly called Sunday, or on the day of any election held in said county under the constitution and laws of this State or of the United States.

How construed

SUB-SECTION W. In any criminal prosecution under this act, it shall only be necessary to state that the traverser did sell, barter or give away spirituous liquor or fermented liquor, without specifying the particular kind of liquor so sold, bartered or given away.

Criminal prosecution.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the provisions of chapter one hundred and fifty-eight of the acts passed at January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-six, of the General Assembly of Maryland, mentioned in the titling to this bill, shall continue and remain in force, so far as the same refer to Princess Anne district aforesaid, until the adoption and proclamation of this act as hereinbefore required, and this law shall take effect in said Princess Anne district upon the proclamation of the result of the election herein mentioned and required; but nothing contained in this act shall be construed in any manner to affect the provisions of said chapter one hundred and fifty-eight of the acts passed at January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-six, aforesaid, so far as they refer to Hungary Neck district, number five, therein mentioned.
