

cock between the first day of January and the first day of July; nor any pheasant between the first day of January and the first day of September; nor any wood-duck between the first day of January and the first day of September; nor any wild turkey between the first day of February and the first day of November; no person shall shoot any rabbit between the fifteenth day of December and the first day of November, but the trapping and running of rabbits shall be lawful from the fifteenth day of October until the fifteenth day of January.

57. Any person violating any of the provisions of the four preceding sections on conviction thereof, shall be fined ten dollars and costs, to be recovered in the name of the State before a justice of the peace; and in default of payment shall be committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty days; all fines recovered under this section shall be disbursed as follows: one-half to the informer, and the remainder to the public schools of said county.

#### CHAPTER 166.

AN ACT to repeal section one hundred and fifty-three, of article four, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Coroners Inquest and Dead Bodies," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section one hundred and fifty-three, of article four, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Coroners Inquest and Dead Bodies," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Repeal.

153. Any public officer of Baltimore city or Baltimore county having charge of or control over the bodies of deceased persons required to be buried at the public expense, or at the expense of any institution supported by said city or county shall notify the chairman of the anatomy board, said board being composed of a demonstrator of anatomy from each medical school in the State of the existence and possession of such bodies, and shall give permission to said anatomy board through its chairman or to any physician or surgeon of the State of Maryland, upon his request made therefor, to take such bodies within forty-eight hours after death, to be given by him used within the State for the advancement of medical science, preference being given to medical schools,
