

Effective. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage; provided, however, that all licenses now in force shall continue until the first day of May, eighteen hundred and ninety.

CHAPTER 344.

AN ACT to amend article eleven, of the Code of Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland, entitled "Frederick county," sub-title "New Market," by adding an additional section thereto, to be known as "Section three hundred and ninety-four A."

To add. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That article eleven, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, entitled "Frederick county," sub-title "New Market," be and the same is hereby amended by adding an additional section to be known as "Section three hundred and ninety-four A," and to read as follows:

To grade. SEC. 394 A. The said commissioners shall have power, and it shall be their duty to fix the grade of all pavements and sidewalks within the corporate limits of said town of New Market, whenever said pavements or sidewalks are being made, renewed or repaired.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 345.

AN ACT to give and grant the sanction and consent of the General Assembly, to a sale and conveyance from John J. Thompson and wife to the reformed church of Baltimore.

To sanction. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sanction and consent of the said General Assembly, be and is hereby given to the sale, grant and conveyance in fee, to and for the use of the reformed presbyterian church of Baltimore, a body corporate, duly incorporated under the laws of this State, from John J. Thompson and wife of certain property lying at the southeast intersection of Harford avenue and Chase street, in Baltimore city, and more particularly described in a deed from said John J. Thompson and wife to said reformed presbyterian
