

CHAPTER 444.

AN ACT to repeal sections forty-one, forty-two, forty-three, forty-four, forty-five and forty-six, of article twenty-three, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Wicomico county," sub-title "Fences," so far as the same shall apply to election districts two, (Quantico,) three, (Tyaskin,) and six, (Dennis,) of said county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland.* That sections forty-one, forty-two, forty-three, forty-four, forty-five and forty-six, of article twenty-three, of the Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Wicomico county," sub-title "Fences," be and the same are hereby repealed so far as the same shall apply to election districts two, (Quantico,) three, (Tyaskin,) and six, (Dennis,) of said county. Repeal.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the first day of June, eighteen hundred and ninety. Effective.

CHAPTER 445.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to support the Maryland line confederate soldiers' home at Pikesville.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sum of five thousand dollars, for each fiscal year, eighteen hundred and ninety-one and eighteen hundred and ninety-two, be and the same is hereby appropriated for the support of needy and destitute confederate soldiers at the Maryland line confederate soldiers' home at Pikesville. Appropriate.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That said sum shall be paid to the association of the Maryland line, to be expended in putting and keeping in repair the buildings at Pikesville arsenal, which belong to the State, and in supporting, taking care of such destitute and decrepit confederate soldiers, as said association shall deem worthy.
