

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to provide for the separate codification of the statute and common law, defining the jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace and the offences cognizable by said Justices, with the respective penalties thereto attached.

Which was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 136, of Article 37, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Gunning," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Mr. Collins submitted the following proposed amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

After the words "Dorchester county," at end of section 1, add "that nothing in this Act shall apply to Talbot and Harford counties."

Which was adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was then read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also, favorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal section 32, of Article 93, title "Testamentary Law," sub title "Administration," of the Code of Public General Laws, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was read a second time.

Also, unfavorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 17, of the Acts of 1892, entitled an Act to add two additional sections to Article 27, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Railroad Obstructing," to follow section 231 and to be known as sections 231 A and 231 B.

Which was adopted.

Also, favorably, with proposed amendments,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 217, of Article 23, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Corporations," sub-title "Religious Corporations."
