

and insert the words "That is to say, the excess of such paper over and above the amount of taxes levied therefor but remaining uncollected."

5th. That the House concur in Senate amendment in section 7, line 5, next after the word "warrants," insert the words "relating to the affairs of said county."

6th. That the House concur in Senate amendment in section 8, line 60, strike out "issued," and insert "as issued for issue."

7th. That the House concur in Senate amendment next after section 9, insert a new section 10.

"Sec. 10. And be it enacted, That any misapplication of the funds provided for by this Act by the said County Commissioners shall render them, and each and all of them participating in such misapplication or misuse, liable to indictment by the Grand Jury, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment in jail for not less than one, nor more than five years, and limitations shall be no bar to said indictment.
