Leave was granted to the St. Mary's County Delegation and Mr. Ireland to introduce a bill entitled an Act regulating the number, terms, sessions and compensation of the County Commissioners for St. Mary's county.

Leave was granted to the St. Mary's County Delegation and Mr. Lane to introduce a bill entitled an Act regulating the compensation of Jurors, Bailiffs, Crier and Messenger to the Circuit Court for St. Mary's county.
