

BILLS—THIRD READING.

House bill entitled an Act to pay the claim of J. H. Medairy & Co., for stationery furnished the Executive and Legislative Department, Court of Appeals and State Library for 1891 and 1892.

Was read a third time, and passed by yeas and nays, as follows:
