

House bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 16, of the Acts of 1880, entitled an Act to adjust and settle finally by agreement all pending controversies between the State of Maryland and the Northern Central Railway Company, by subjecting the franchises and property of said company within this State to taxation to a certain extent, and to provide for the payment of certain indebtedness claimed by the State of Maryland to exist on the part of said Northern Central Railway Company to said State of Maryland.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 9, 10 and 12, of Article 13, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Bills of Exchange and Promissory Notes," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact section 28, of Article 56, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Licenses," sub-title "Hawkers and Pedlars," so as the same applies to Prince George's county.

House bill entitled an Act to amend Article 56, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Licenses," by adding an additional section thereto to follow section 20, under the sub-title of "Brokers," and to be known as "Section 20 A," with proposed amendments.

Were severally read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

BILLS—THIRD READING.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 83, of Article 10, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Dorchester County," sub-title "Cambridge," as amended by the Act of 1890, chapter 311, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Was read a third time, and passed by yeas and nays, as follows:
