

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That any person or persons who shall keep or use any bull, bear or dog for the purpose of fighting or baiting the same, or as a target to be shot at, either for amusement or as a test of skill in marksmanship, or who shall be a party to or be present as a spectator at any such fighting, baiting or shooting of any bear, bull or dog, or any person who shall rent any room, shed, ground or premises for the purpose of fighting, baiting or shooting any animal as aforesaid, shall, upon conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and be punished by a fine of not less than twenty dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or be imprisoned in the jail of the city of Baltimore for not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days, or be both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the court before whom such person or persons may be tried and convicted.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from and after the first day of April, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight.

CHAPTER 388.

AN ACT to prohibit stock from going at large on the public roads in school district number six of election district number one of Queen Anne's county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That all horses, mules, cattle, sheep, and swine, shall be and are by this act prohibited from going at large on any public road or public ground within the limits of school district number six (Sudlersville District) of election district number one of Queen Anne's county.
