Which was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

House bill, File No. 569, entitled "An Act to authorize, empower and direct the Board of Police Commissioners for Baltimore city, to reinstate Charles Creamer."

In line 4 of section 1, strike out the words "and directed" and insert in lieu thereof "and empowered."

Which was adopted.

Which was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also favorably,

House bill, File No. 859, entitled "An Act to add three additional sections to Article 4, Code of Public Local Laws, title 'City of Baltimore,' sub-title 'Charter,' heading 'Illuminating Oils and Fluids,' as enacted by chapter 123, Acts of 1898, to be known as 'Sections 456 A, 456 B and 456 C.'"

Which was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also favorably, with amendments,

House bill, File No. 742, entitled "An Act to pension Tobias Jacobs, retired officer."
