Which request was granted.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates appeared and delivered the following bills:

House bill entitled an Act to repeal Chapter 160, of the Acts of 1876, entitled an Act to encourage the killing of Hawks, Big Owls, Foxes and Weasels, in the counties of Charles and Calvert.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Senators Wilson, Lancaster and Combs, of St. Mary's.

House bill entitled an Act for the better protection of insectivorous birds in Somerset County.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Senators Dennis, Humphreys and Franklin.

House bill entitled an Act to encourage the destruction of large Hawks and Owls in Somerset County.

Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Dennis, Humphreys and Franklin.

House bill entitled an Act to create a new Election District in Somerset County, and comprising all that territory belonging to the State of Maryland, on Smith's Island.

Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Dennis, Humphreys and Stump.

Senate bill entitled an Act to define and preserve the inner harbor of Cambridge and Cambridge Creek, in Dorchester County,
