

Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Dorchester County", sub-title "Vienna", defining the powers of the Commissioners of Vienna and fixing the amount said Commissioners may borrow on their notes, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

533. The said Commissioners shall also have power to impose license fees on any business, occupation or employment conducted in said town whether temporary or permanent; to provide for fire protection, police protection, for lights upon the highways of the town; to arrange for a supply of water for fire protection and for the use of its citizens; and to borrow money on their notes or certificates of indebtedness to an amount not to exceed one thousand dollars, in any one year, this borrowing right to be in addition to any other borrowing right that the said Commissioners of Vienna now have.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency law necessary for the immediate preservation of the public safety and health, and being passed upon the yea and nay vote, supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 206.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 207 of Article 2 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Anne Arundel County", sub-title "County Commissioners", and to repeal Section 196 of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1924 Edition), title "Elections", sub-title "Primary Elections" (said section relating to the nomination of candidates for County Commissioners of Anne Arundel County), reducing the number of County Commissioners for Anne Arundel County, providing for their nomination, fixing their compensation, and providing for submission of this Act to the voters of Anne Arundel County for adoption or rejection at the election in November, 1940.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 207 of Article 2 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Anne Arundel Coun-
