

under sub-title "Coal", and to follow immediately after Section 35 of said Article, and to add a new section to Article 11 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Frederick County", said new section to be known as Section 89A, to be under sub-title "Coal", and to follow immediately after Section 89 of said Article, and to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 136 of Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Washington County", sub-title "Coal", regulating the sale of coal and coke in said Counties.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That a new section be and it is hereby added to Article 7 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Carroll County", said new section to be known as Section 35A, to be under sub-title "Coal", to follow immediately after Section 35 of said Article, and to read as follows:

35A. For the purpose of this section, the term "persons" shall be construed to include individuals, corporations, partnerships and associations and his, her or its agents, officers, servants and employees delivering, selling, or offering for sale coal and coke.

It shall be unlawful for any person to deliver, sell or offer for sale any load of coal or coke in Carroll County without a ticket or card which shall indicate on its face in plain characters the vendor's name, the date, and the weight of such coal or coke separately to each consumer, the kind of coal or coke the name of the purchaser, vendee or consignee. Such coal or coke shall be weighed on some regularly tested truck or wagon scale in Carroll County agreeable both to seller and consumer on the same day of and before delivery and the ticket or card indicating such weight shall be signed by a weigher in Carroll County, whose name and address shall be indicated on said ticket or card, provided, however, that when a car load of coal or coke is delivered by rail to a consumer in Carroll County the railroad weight shall be permitted to govern sale and delivery of said sale of said coal and coke.

The violation of any of the provisions of this section is hereby declared to be a misdemeanor to be punishable, upon conviction, by fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), or imprisonment in jail for not less than five days nor more than thirty days, or both fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That a new section be and it is hereby added to Article 11 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Frederick County",
