The vote by which said bill was passed,

Was reconsidered.

The Senate bill entitled an Act for the relief of Rachael Wilson, by refunding State and county taxes, erroneously, was reported favorably, with proposed amendments.

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Amend by adding at end of line 2, of Section 2, the words "in their discretion."

Which was adopted, and the bill read a second time.

Mr. Boyer, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 81, of Article 14, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Kent county," sub-title "County Commissioners," and to amend and reenact the same with amendments, and to add a sub-section thereto, and to provide for the appointment of two County Commissioners by the Governor, to serve until the next general election.

With proposed amendments.

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Amend by adding after the word "enacted," in Section 2, the following:

"And said Board of County Commissioners shall meet as often as necessary, from the first day of January, until the annual levy shall be made, but shall not meet after said levy, and until the first day of January next, succeeding, except on the first Tuesday of each month."

"Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage."

Which were severally read and adopted.
