The Senate bill entitled an Act to prevent stock running at large in Baltimore county within fifteen miles of Baltimore city,

Being upon its third reading,

Wr. Whitelock submitted the following amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Strike out entire bill and insert in lieu thereof.

A bill entitled an Act to prevent stock running at large in Baltimore county within six miles from Baltimore city.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall not be lawful for stock of any kind to go at large and without attendants within the distance of six miles from the limits of Baltimore city.
