Leave was granted to the Select Committee on Temperance to introduce a bill to prohibit the manufacture or sale of adulterated, spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer in his State.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Ways and Means to introduce a bill to require the Comptroller of the Treasury to issue his warrant on the Treasurer to pay each merchant and hotel keeper in Dorchester and Caroline counties the amount of money paid for license to sell liquor in 1874, for which they were debarred the use of by the passage of the Local Option Law in that county.
