Also, delivered the following bills:

House bill entitled an Act to repeal any supposed exemptions of the capital stock of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, or of any of its branch roads, or its or their property, real personal or mixed from taxation for State, county or municipal purposes.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 2, Article 36 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Estrays and Vessels Adrift," so far as the same relates to Dorchester county, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Phelps, Aydelotte and Cooper.

House bill entitled an Act for the protection of Sheep Husbandry.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

House bill entitled an Act to remove all gates from the public roads of Charles county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mudd, Suit and Steiner.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 77 of the Public Local Laws of Worcester county, passed January Session, 1874, relating to oysters in Sinepuxent Bay and its tributaries, and to re-enact the same with amendments, also, to protect fish therein.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Aydelotte, Humphreys and Dennis.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 1 of Article 38 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Officers Fees," and to re-enact the same so far as relates to Dorchester county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Phelps, Aydelotte and Cooper.
