- Liber 45**—*Rent Roll Somerset No. 3.* 237 pages; typed index of tract names; contains additional rent rolls of Somerset County 1735-1765; alienations to 1772.
- Liber 46**—*Rent Roll Somerset No. 4.* 67 pages; typed index of tract names; contains additional rent rolls of Somerset County 1766-1775 plus names, owners and acreages of lands patented 1782-1790; alienations to 1772.
- Liber 47**—*Rent Roll Talbot No. 3.* 126 pages; typed index of tract names; entries on lands patented to 1755; no alienations. Entries are arranged alphabetically according to the name of the person paying the rent.
- Liber 48**—*Rent Roll Worcester No. 1.* 169 pages; typed index of tract names; contains additional rent rolls of Worcester County 1743-1762; alienations to 1763.
- Liber 49**—*Rent Roll Worcester No. 2.* 125 pages; typed index of tract names; contains additional rent rolls 1763-1775 plus names, owners and acreages of lands patented 1782-1790; only one or two alienation entries.

DEBT BOOK SERIES

- Liber 1**—*Debt Book 1753, 54, 55, 56 Anne Arundel County.* Four small books bound together, each containing the list of persons owning property, the names of each piece of property and its rent and the total rent as paid in the years 1753, 1754, 1755, 1756. The 1753 debt book has 89 pages; 1754 has 82 pages; 1755 has 91 (not all numbered); 1756 has 72 pages and the entries, unlike the preceding books, are here arranged alphabetically by names of rent-payers.
- Liber 2**—*Debt Book 1757, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63 Anne Arundel County.* Seven small books bound together, each containing entries as above. The 1757 debt book has 69 pages; 1758 has 55; 1759 has 80; 1760 has 71; 1761 has 62; 1762 has 65 and 1763 has 59 pages. All are arranged alphabetically by names of rent-payers.
- Liber 3**—*Debt Books 1764, 65, 66, 67, 68 Anne Arundel County.* Five small books bound together, each containing en-
