

eighteen hundred and seventy-six, relating to the protection of partridges in certain counties so far only as the same relates to Queen Anne's county," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall not be lawful to shoot or trap any partridges or rabbits in Queen Anne's county from the tenth (10th) day of January to the first (1st) day of November in any year, and woodcock from the tenth (10th) day of January to the first (1st) day of July in each and every year.

When unlawful.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Who to issue warrant.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby requested and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer to pay to W. L. Pfeiffer, one hundred and sixty-nine dollars, for furniture furnished the Senate and House of Delegates; to Wm. T. Markland & Bro., eighty-six dollars and one cent, for slating and trimming at State Tobacco Warehouse number three; to N. W. Bryan, for expressage for State Library, five dollars and twenty-five cents; to John K. Carroll, fifty-eight dollars and fifty cents, for hoops furnished State Tobacco Warehouse number one; to Samuel Miskimond, for articles furnished State Tobacco Warehouse number two, fourteen dollars; to J. R. Hudgins, forty-nine dollars and seventy-five cents, for tools furnished State Tobacco Warehouses number one and two, and to W. S. Taylor & Company
