Gentlemen, when I first became Secretary of 1 the Maryland State Teachers Association twenty-two years 2 ago, this coming February, this was just barely over the hill in Baltimore City, and there was a vestige of it still going on in Cecil County on such things as the orders 5 for textbooks and other supplies in the various schools 6 from which the School Board members came. This is con-7 firmed by the report of the Commission established in 1914. 8 as reported by Doctors Abraham Flexner and Frank B. Bach-9 10 man. May I say this again reports one of the land-11 marks in educational surveys.
