THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Graves, would you enlighten us on that?

DR. GRAVES: Of course, like most students of government, I am interested in this thing. I think there are only two legislatures that are elected on a so-called nonpartisan basis, in Nebraska and Minnesota, and if the gentleman over here had not raised the question, I was ready to do it, too.

I did have an opportunity for a few months, a few years ago, when the Minnesota Legislature was in session and I was a visiting member of the department at the university, to watch this thing, and nonpartisanship in Minnesota, I think, is largely a fake. All it means is that the names of the parties and the party emblems are not on the ballot, but everybody knows who the candidates are for, what party they belong to, that is, as any knowledgeable and informed person knows; and I have regarded it as just one of those things that we Americans
