2     what can the Governor do about it? Isn't the Governor  
3     constitutionally required to submit that to the legislature?

4             MR. PERKINS: He can do anything he wants with  
5     it. He can cut all he wants from the budget of the college.

6             DR. JENKINS: The answer to that question is no,  
7     the Governor is not constitutionally --

8             MR. PERKINS: By Constitution, he is not, no.

9             THE CHAIRMAN: Let me put it to you by example,  
10    Mr. Perkins. Suppose this \$340 times the number students  
11    we will say that the number that Dr. Sensenbaugh comes up  
12    with is 1,450,000. I'm just pulling a figure out of the air,  
13    1,450,000. Now, you being a conscientious budget analyst,  
14    you have looked into this thing and you know darn well that  
15    it is only going to be 1,400,000, and so you argue back and  
16    forth and neither will give.

17             So, finally Dr. Sensenbaugh says, well, the  
18    State Board is meeting tomorrow and I am going to present  
19    the budget to them on the basis of 1,450,000 students and  
20    I am very sorry, Mr. Perkins, but that is the way it is,  
21    and that is what I am going to ask my Board to approve,
