SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the treasurer be and he is hereby directed and required, upon the warrant of the comptroller, to pay to William S. Moore the sum of three hundred and eighty-two dollars and sixty-six cents, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

### Chapter 163.

AN ACT to prevent the sale of all kinds of intoxicating drinks in Frederick county within one and one-half miles of Mount Saint Mary's College.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That it shall not be lawful for any person to sell, barter or otherwise dispose of for gain, any spirituous or fermented liquors, beer, ale or intoxicating drinks of any kind, in quantities less than one gallon, within one and one-half miles of the principal front gate of Mount Saint Mary's College, in Frederick county.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That any person violating the provisions of the preceding section shall be liable to indictment by the grand jury of Frederick county, and shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each and every offence; one half of said fine shall be paid to the informer, and the other half to the county commissioners of said county, for the use of the public schools.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
