

WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. PERSONAL PROPERTY: assessed value £202.0.0, including 3 slaves, 1783. **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** at least 200 acres in Cecil County. **SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH:** ca. 530 acres inherited in 1781 and 1783; 127 acres of vacant land added to a patent resurvey, 1783; 376 acres purchased, 1790–1793; 963 acres sold, 1792–1799 (over 600 acres of this was disposed of in 1799). **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** January 14, 1819, in Virginia (later became part of West Virginia); size of estate unknown.

BOND, THOMAS (?–ca. 1797). **BORN:** in St. Mary's County, of age by 1760. **NATIVE:** at least third generation. **RESIDED:** in Upper Resurrection Hundred, St. Mary's County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** Capt. John Bond (?–1760), son of Zachariah Bond (?–ca. 1716). **MOTHER:** Elizabeth, daughter of John Attaway (?–1732), of St. Mary's County. **UNCLE:** *Zachariah Bond* (?–ca. 1776). **BROTHERS:** Gerard (?–1789), died without progeny; Samuel; John; Richard; and William. **SISTERS:** Susannah, who married (first name unknown) Bates; Elizabeth, who married (first name unknown) Jordan; Margaret, who married (first name unknown) Sothoron. **FIRST COUSIN:** (first name unknown) Bond, who married *Henry Greenfield Sothoron* (ca. 1732–1793). **MARRIED** by 1757 Cecelia (?–ca. 1797), widow of Dr. John Key (?–1755), son of *Philip Key* (1696/97–1764); daughter of Dr. Gustavus Brown (?–1762); stepdaughter of Margaret; niece of Anne Brown Claggett Horner, who married third, *Samuel Hanson* (1716–1794). Her brother was Richard. Her sisters were Sarah, who married (first name unknown) Scott; Mary, who married (first name unknown) Throkeld; Elizabeth, who married (first name unknown) Wallace; Jane, who married (first name unknown) Campbell; and Anne, who married (first name unknown) Claggett. **CHILDREN. SONS:** Peregrine; Thomas; and John. **STEPSON:** *Philip Key* (1750–1820). **DAUGHTERS:** Cecelia, who married (first name unknown) Gardiner; Elizabeth, who married (first name unknown) Briscoe. **STEPDAUGHTER:** Susannah Gardiner Key. **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Anglican, All Faiths Parish, St. Mary's County. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Mr., by 1767; Esq., by death. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter; owned a mill in St. Clement's Hundred, St. Mary's County. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, St. Mary's County, 1773–1774 (Bills of Credit 1, Cv, 2, 3), 1782–1783 (Claims 1, 2), 1785, 1790, 1791–1792. **LOCAL OFFICES:** justice, St.

Mary's County, in office 1764–1773, 1778—at least 1792; justice, Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery, St. Mary's County, commissioned 1768 and 1772; justice, Orphans' Court, St. Mary's County, 1778—at least 1786; commissioner of tax, St. Mary's County, 1779—at least 1785. **MILITARY SERVICE:** called major, period of service unknown. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. PERSONAL PROPERTY:** 12 slaves, 1790; assessed value £97.0.0, including 2 slaves and plate, 1793. He petitioned as an insolvent debtor in 1794. **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** 765 acres in St. Mary's County (438 acres inherited from his father, 1760; 7 acres by patent, 1758). **SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH:** owned 494 acres in 1793, but listed only 340 acres in insolvency petition in 1794, all in St. Mary's County. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** inventory dated December 12, 1797, St. Mary's County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £312.17.1 current money; FB, £283.17.10. **LAND:** at least 140 acres in St. Mary's County.

BOND, THOMAS, OF THOMAS (?–1800). **BORN:** in Baltimore County, of age by 1770; eldest son. **NATIVE:** fifth generation. **RESIDED:** at "Isle of Caprea," Baltimore County (later became part of Harford County). **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** Thomas Bond (1703–1788), of Harford County; a farmer; son of Thomas Bond (?–1755) and wife Ann Robisson (Robertson). **MOTHER:** Elizabeth (1705–?), daughter of *Daniel Scott* (?–1744/45). **UNCLE:** *Jacob Bond* (ca. 1725–1780). **BROTHER:** Daniel (?–by 1787). **SISTERS:** Ann, who married William Clemments, of Charles County; Elizabeth (?–by 1787), who married (first name unknown) Howard; Hannah, who married first, Zacheus Onion, and second, William Maccomas; Martha (1747–?), who married (first name unknown) Smith; and Sarah (?–by 1787), who married (first name unknown) Howard. **FIRST COUSINS:** *William Bond, of Joshua* (ca. 1747–1788); *James Bond* (ca. 1757–1803); and Ann, who married second, *James Giles* (1749/50–?); *Aquila Scott* (1756–?); *James McComas* (1735–1791); Elizabeth Scott, who married *William Smithson* (ca. 1744–1809). **MARRIED** by 1771 his first cousin Catherine (by 1746–by 1795), daughter of William Fell (?–1746) and wife Sarah; granddaughter of Thomas Bond (?–1755). Her brother was Edward (1736–1763), who married Ann Bond. Her sisters were Janet, who married (first name unknown) Few; Ann, who married (first name unknown) Day; and Margaret. Her nephew was *William Fell* (1759–1786). **CHILDREN. SONS:** Fell; Edward; and Thomas. **DAUGHTERS:**
