

Cook, rector of Christ Church Parish, Calvert County, from 1749/50 to 1761., Regia, who married (first name unknown) Broome; and Diana, who married Charles Clagett. **PRIVATE CAREER.** **EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Protestant. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Calvert County, 1708A, 1708B–1711, 1716–1718. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** at least 675 acres and probably considerable additional acreage. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** will probated on July 14, 1742. **LAND:** over 2,294 acres.

DARE, WILLIAM (?–1719). **BORN:** in England. **IMMIGRATED:** by 1675 as a free adult from Dorchester, England. **RESIDED:** in Calvert County; Cecil County, by 1681. **MARRIED** by 1689 Margaret. **CHILDREN.** **SON:** *William Dare* (?–ca. 1721/22). **DAUGHTER:** Mary, who married John Thompson, son of *John Thompson* (?–1701); Margaret (?–1718), who married in 1707 *Roger Larramore* (?–1721). **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Protestant. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** migrated to settle the affairs of John Parker, a factor for a firm in Dorset, England; returned to England briefly, but resettled in Maryland by 1677, bringing eight others with him; Gent., by 1684. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** factor to William Twiss and John West, mercers of Dorset, England, 1670; mercer of Dorset, England, 1672; merchant; planter. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Cecil County, 1686–1688; Associates' Convention, Cecil County, 1689 (no record of attendance after the 1st session); Lower House, Cecil County, 1692 (dismissed from the 1st session for failure to provide security for good behavior), 1704–1707, 1712–1714. **LOCAL OFFICES:** justice, Cecil County, 1681–1689, 1694–1698, 1708–1715 (quorum, 1685–1689, 1694–1698, 1708–1715). **STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES:** opposed the revolution of 1689 and was not returned to public office until the tenure of Gov. Francis Nicholson. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** at least 1,950 acres and probably 700 additional acres. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** will probated on August 13, 1719. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £225.17.10 sterling (including 7 slaves and books). **LAND:** 2,070 acres.

DARE, WILLIAM (?–ca. 1721/22). **BORN:** probably in Cecil County. **NATIVE:** second generation. **RESIDED:** in Cecil County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** *William Dare* (?–1719). **SISTERS:** Mary,

who married John Thompson, son of *John Thompson* (?–1701); Margaret (?–1718), who married in 1707 *Roger Larramore* (?–1721). **CHILDREN. DAUGHTERS:** Catherine, who was underage at the time of her father's death and was placed in the care of her aunt, Mary Dare Thompson; Margaret, also underage at the time of her father's death and who was placed in care of a family friend, Capt. *Benjamin Pearce* (1711/12–1756); and Mary, also underage at the time of her father's death. **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Anglican. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Mr., 1715; Gent., 1719. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** merchant. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Cecil County, 1719–1720 (appointed sheriff between the 3rd and 4th sessions). **LOCAL OFFICES:** undersheriff, Cecil County, appointed 1716; justice, Cecil County, 1720–1721; sheriff, Cecil County, commissioned 1721. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** ca. 1,050 acres in Cecil County (all inherited from his father). **SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH:** sold 150 acres in Cecil County, 1719. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** will probated on February 24, 1721/22, in Cecil County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £324.11.6 current money (including 5 slaves, 1 servant, and books); FB, estate overpaid £198.10.5. **LAND:** 900 acres in Cecil County.

DARNALL, HENRY (ca. 1645–1711). **BORN:** ca. 1645 in Hertfordshire, England. **IMMIGRATED:** by 1664 as a free adult. **RESIDED:** in Calvert County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** Philip Darnall (1604–?), secretary to Sir George Calvert, 1st Lord Baltimore. **MOTHER:** Mary Calvert, sister of Lord Talbot. **BROTHER:** *John Darnall* (?–1684). **SISTER:** Elizabeth. **COUSIN:** *Charles Calvert, 3rd Lord Baltimore* (1637–1714/15). **MARRIED** first, name unknown. **MARRIED** second, Elinor (1642–1725), widow of *Thomas Brooke* (1632–1676); daughter of Richard Hatton and wife Margaret; stepdaughter of *Richard Banks* (ca. 1612–ca. 1667); niece of *Thomas Hatton* (?–1654/55). Her brothers were *William Hatton* (?–1712); Richard. Her sisters were Mary, who married *Zachary Wade* (ca. 1627–1678); Elizabeth, who married first, *Luke Gardiner* (1622–1674), and second, *Clement Hill* (?–1708); and Barbara, who married *James Johnson* (?–?). **CHILDREN. SONS:** Philip (1671–1705), who married Elinor, daughter of *Thomas Brooke* (1632–1676); Henry (1682–1759), who married Ann, daughter of *William Digges* (ca. 1650–1697). **STEPSONS:** *Thomas Brooke* (ca. 1659–1730/31), who married first, Ann, and second, Barbara
