

Richard Hatton; niece of *Thomas Hatton* (?–1654/55). She subsequently married *Clement Hill* (?–1708). Her brothers were *William Hatton* (?–1712); Richard. Her sisters were Mary, who married *Zachary Wade* (ca. 1627–1678); Elinor (1642–1725), who married first, *Thomas Brooke* (1632–1676), and second, *Henry Darnall* (ca. 1645–1711); and Barbara, who married *James Johnson* (?–?). CHILDREN. SONS: *Richard Gardiner* (?–1687), who married Elizabeth, daughter of Maj. John Ware, of Rappahannock, Virginia; John, who married Mary, daughter of *William Boreman* (ca. 1630–1709); Luke, who married Monica; and Thomas. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Catholic. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: servant or apprentice to Thomas Copley in 1637; designated Gent. or by a military title after 1660. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: servant or apprentice, 1637; planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, St. Mary's County, 1659/60 (elected to fill vacancy), 1661, 1662, 1671 (resigned after the 2nd session to become sheriff). LOCAL OFFICES: justice, St. Mary's County, 1661–1666, 1668–1672 (quorum, 1664–1666, 1668–1672); sheriff, St. Mary's County, 1672–1674. MILITARY SERVICE: lieutenant by 1660/61; captain, by 1664, still serving in 1670. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: operated 4 separate plantations. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: by August 1674. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, £632.18.0 sterling (including 3 slaves and 10 servants). LAND: over 5,000 acres.

GARDINER, RICHARD (?–1687). BORN: in St. Mary's County; oldest son. NATIVE: third generation. RESIDED: in St. Mary's County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: *Luke Gardiner* (1622–1674). STEPFATHER: *Clement Hill* (?–1708). MOTHER: Elizabeth Hatton. UNCLES: *Richard Lusthead* (?–1642); *William Hatton* (?–1712); *Zachary Wade* (ca. 1627–1678); *Thomas Brooke* (1632–1676); *Henry Darnall* (ca. 1645–1711); and *James Johnson* (?–?). BROTHERS: John, who married Mary, daughter of *William Boreman* (ca. 1630–1709); Luke; and Thomas. FIRST COUSIN: *Thomas Brooke* (ca. 1659–1730/31). MARRIED Elizabeth, daughter of Maj. John Ware, of Rappahannock, Virginia. CHILDREN. SONS: John; Luke. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Catholic. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: third generation burgess; sons held no known office. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter; merchant; owned a gristmill. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, St. Mary's

County, 1681–1682 (elected to the 3rd session), 1686 (died before the 2nd session). LOCAL OFFICES: coroner, St. Mary's County, 1676; justice, St. Mary's County, 1677–1687 (quorum, 1686–1687). WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: at least 1,200 acres inherited from his father. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: will probated on December 3, 1687. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, £1,338.17.8 sterling (including 17 slaves and 3 servants); FB, £26.3.8. LAND: over 1,200 acres.

GARRETT, AMOS (1671–1727/28). BORN: in 1671 in England. IMMIGRATED: by 1701 as a free adult. RESIDED: in Annapolis, Anne Arundel County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: James Garrett. MOTHER: Sarah, by 1727/28, "late of St. Olives St., Southwark," England. SISTERS: Mary, who married Henry Woodward; Elizabeth Ginn. NEPHEW: Amos Woodward. MARRIED never. CHILDREN. Died without progeny. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Anglican. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: served as agent for Sir *Thomas Lawrence* (ca. 1645–1714); one of the richest men in Maryland; important in development of Annapolis. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: merchant; planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Annapolis, 1712–1714 (Laws 2–4; Aggrievances 1), 1715, 1720–1721/22 (elected to the 2nd session to fill vacancy). LOCAL OFFICES: justice, Anne Arundel County, by 1702–1706 (quorum, 1704–1706); St. Anne's Parish Vestry, Anne Arundel County, 1704–1706; mayor, Annapolis, 1708; alderman, Annapolis, by 1720–1726. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: 8,000 acres in 1714. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: on March 8, 1727/28; excessive drinking may have caused his death; the total cost for his funeral exceeded £442.19.2, with over 1,000 Bibles and other holy books distributed to mourners. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, £1,047.11.10 sterling, £11,508.5.3 current money (including 68 slaves and 10 servants). LAND: over 8,000 acres.

GARRETT, AMOS (1723–ca. 1789). BORN: on June 10, 1723, in St. George's Parish, Baltimore County; elder son. NATIVE: probably third generation. RESIDED: in Baltimore County (later became Harford County); Spesutia Lower Hundred, Harford County, by 1783. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: Bennett Garrett (?–1740), of St. George's Parish, Baltimore County, who was probably the son of Richard Garrett (?–1709). MOTHER: Arabella (?–1737). STEPMOTHER: Martha Presbury.
