LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Assembly, Kent County, 1641/42 (Aggrievances). LOCAL OFFICE: justice, Kent County, 1642. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. PERSONAL PROPERTY: paid the fourth highest assessment, both in August 1642 and in December 1642, Kent County. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: not mentioned in the records after 1642.

LONDON, AMBROSE (?-by 1706). IMMI-GRATED: in 1665, as a free adult with family, from Northampton, Virginia, where he had settled by June 1659. RESIDED: in the Annemessex area, Somerset County. MARRIED Mary (last name unknown). CHILDREN. SON: Thomas. DAUGHTERS: Abigail (?-1692), who married in 1682 Thomas Leister: Ruth, who married in 1677 Thomas Walston; and Mary, who married in 1667 Teague Riggin. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RE-LIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Protestant, probably a Quaker. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: was persecuted in Virginia in 1663/64 for "not coming to church . . . appeared under the notion of a Quaker"; religious persecution probably prompted the move to Maryland; no title on arrival. OC-CUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Somerset County, 1671-1674/75 (elected, but did not attend). LOCAL OFFICE: justice, Somerset County, 1679/80-1683. MILITARY SERVICE: major, 1680-1683. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: at least 425 acres in Somerset County. SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH: probably purchased at least 26 acres in Somerset County by 1685; received an additional 50 acres in Somerset County by grant, 1687. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: by November 1706, probably in Somerset County. PER-SONAL PROPERTY: size of estate unknown. LAND: had sold 501 acres in Somerset County by 1694.

LONG, THOMAS (?-1691). IMMIGRATED: possibly in 1668, as a free adult. RESIDED: possibly in Talbot County; in Baltimore County by 1672. MARRIED by June 1676 Jane (?-1696), widow of

both (first name unknown) Waites (Wright, Wertes) and John Dixon (?-1670) of Baltimore County, Gent. Jane immigrated as Dixon's wife ca. 1664. CHILDREN, SON: Thomas, DAUGHTERS: Tabitha, who married by 1699 Henry King; probably Jane, who married Joseph Peake (?-1700). STEPDAUGHTERS: Christiana Waites (Wright, Wertes), who married by 1681 Francis Watkins (?-1696); Abigail Dixon, who married by 1689 John Haies. Jane Peake may have been Long's stepdaughter. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Protestant. OC-CUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter; merchant. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Baltimore County, 1683-1684 (elected to the 2nd session of the 1682-1684 Assembly). LOCAL OF-FICES: justice, Baltimore County, 1672-1676, 1679-1686 (quorum, 1675/76-1676, 1679-1686); coroner, Baltimore County, 1675; sheriff, Baltimore County, 1676-1679, 1687-1690. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: between September 12 and October 26. 1691, in Baltimore County. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, £104.10.0 and 25,223 pounds of tobacco (including 6 servants and silver valued at £3.0.0); FB, £33.10.5, overpayment of 33,155 pounds of tobacco. LAND: ca. 2,200 acres in Baltimore County.

LOOCKERMAN (LOOKERMAN), THOMAS WYNN (?-1801). BORN: before 1754 (when he was described as a minor), in Dorchester County. NATIVE: fourth generation, RESIDED: in Great Choptank Hundred, Caroline County, by 1778. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: Thomas Loockerman (?-1753) of Dorchester County, MOTHER: Sidney, daughter of Charles Dickinson (?-1779), a merchant of Dorchester and Caroline counties. UNCLES: Henry Dickinson (?-1789): John Dickinson (ca. 1726-1789). AUNT: Margaret Dickinson, who married Philip Walker (?-1791). MAR-RIED If Loockerman had a wife, her name is not known. His grandfather's will, probated in 1779, stated that Mary Ann Gray was Loockerman's mistress and that she had borne him a bastard child. CHILDREN. SONS: Thomas Wynn (?-1829).
