EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Anglican. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Frederick County, 1751-1754 (Accounts 1-6), 1761 (elected to the 3rd convention of the 1758-1761 Assembly to fill vacancy), 1762-1763; 1st Convention, Frederick County, 1774 (appointed, but did not attend). LOCAL OFFICES: justice, Frederick County, 1749-1754; Prince George's Parish Vestry, Frederick (now Montgomery) County, 1752-1755, 1758-1761; tobacco inspector, Frederick County, 1758; Committee of Observation, Frederick County, elected 1775; trustee of the Free School, Frederick Town, Frederick County, 1763. MILITARY SERVICE: captain, 1759. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: 343 acres in Prince George's (later became Frederick and Montgomery) County (313 acres inherited from father, 30 acres by patent). SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH: purchased and patented 1,749 acres in Frederick and Prince George's counties between 1753 and 1766. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: will probated April 25, 1786, in Montgomery County. PERSONAL PROPERTY: included at least 4 slaves, but size of entire estate is unknown. LAND: at least 1,776 acres in Montgomery and Frederick counties were specifically mentioned in his will.

MAGRUDER, SAMUEL (1654-1711). BORN: in 1654, in Calvert County. NATIVE: second generation. RESIDED: in Calvert (later became Prince George's) County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: Alexander Magruder (1610-1677), a possible Scottish prisoner of war, who may have been sent to Maryland as the indentured servant of John Ashcomb in 1652; became a large landowner. MOTHER: Margaret Cambell, widow of Sir Andrew Drummond of Perthshire, Scotland. STEPMOTHER: first, Sarah; and second, Elizabeth Hawkins. BROTHERS OR STEPBROTHERS: Alexander (1671-1746), who married Suzanna; Nathaniel (?-1734). STEPBROTHERS: James (?-1765); John (?-by 1711), who never married. SISTER: Elizabeth, who married John Pottinger. MARRIED Sarah (?-1734), daughter of *Ninian Beale* (ca. 1625-1717/18) and wife Ruth Moore. Her brothers were Ninian (1669-by 1717/18); Charles (1672-

1740); John (1674-?); Thomas; and George (1695-1780). Her sisters were Hester (Esther), who married *Joseph Belt* (ca. 1680-1761); Mary; and Rachel. Her nephews were *Thomas Beall, of George* (1735-1819); *Joshua Beall* (ca. 1719-ca. 1796). CHILDREN. SONS: Samuel, who married Elinor, daughter of Robert Wade; Ninian (?-1751), who married Elizabeth; *John Magruder* (1694-1750); James (1699-?); Alexander (?-1751), who married Anne, daughter of Robert Wade; Nathaniel (?-by 1734); and William (?-1765), who married Mary. DAUGHTERS: Verlinda (?-1745), who married John Beal (?-1742); Mary (?-1734), who married George Clagett; Elizabeth, who married William Beall; Sarah (?-by 1734), who married William Selby; and Eleanor, who married Nehemiah Wade. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Protestant. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter; merchant. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Prince George's County, 1704-1707. LOCAL OFFICES: St. Paul's Parish Vestry, Prince George's County, 1693-1696; justice, Prince George's County, 1697-1705, 1709 (did not qualify). JURY SERVICE: Calvert County Court, February 1681/82; Prince George's County Court, 1696-1697. MILITARY SERVICE: captain, 1698. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: 1,250 acres by 1697, and 1,543 acres in 1706, all in Prince George's County. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: will made on November 23, 1710, and probated April 16, 1711, in Prince George's County. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, £572.4.9 current money (including 15 slaves); FB, £559.15.0. LAND: ca. 1,350 acres in Prince George's County.

MAGRUDER, ZADOCK (1730-1811). BORN: in 1730 in Prince George's County; probably third son. NATIVE: fourth generation. RESIDED: at Ridge Farm, on the tract "Turkey Thickett," Rock Creek Hundred, Frederick (later became Montgomery) County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: *John Magruder* (1694-1750), son of *Samuel Magruder* (1654-1711). MOTHER: Suzanna Smith. BROTHERS: Nathaniel (?-1785); *Nathan Magruder* (ca. 1718-1786). SISTERS: Elizabeth (?-1794); Cassandra; and Rebeckah (a minor in 1750-by 1753). FIRST COUSINS: *Samuel Beall* (ca. 1713-ca. 1778); *Josiah Beall* (?-1768); *Jeremiah Magruder* (1731-1798). MARRIED Rachel (?-1807), widow of William Bowie, Jr. (?-1753), daughter of Robert Pottinger (?-ca. 1754) and wife Ann (?-ca. 1768), who was the sister of Samuel Evans. Rachel's brother was Robert (?-1767). Her sisters were
