MILITARY SERVICE: captain, by 1738. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: 1,438 acres in Kent County. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** DIED: will probated on January 9, 1741/42, in Kent County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, at least £1,182.4.1 (including 20 slaves, 100 oz. plate, 43 books). **LAND:** 1,438 acres in Kent County.

SMITH, WALTER (?–1711). BORN: after 1651, in Calvert County; probably second son. NATIVE: second generation. RESIDED: in Calvert County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** FATHER: *Richard Smith* (?–ca. 1690). MOTHER: Eleanor. BROTHER: Richard (?–1714), surveyor general of both shores, 1693–1697. NEPHEW: *Walter Smith* (ca. 1693–1748). NIECE: Barbara Smith (1693–1764), who married first, *Thomas Holdsworth* (ca. 1692–1718), and second, *Benjamin Mackall* (1675–1761). MARRIED in 1686 Rachel (1671–1730), daughter of *Richard Hall* (?–1688). Her brothers were *Elisha Hall* (1727); Walter (ca. 1692–1734), who married Susannah, daughter of Clement Brooke. DAUGHTERS: Lucy (1688–1770), who married *Thomas Brooke* (1683–1744); Eleanor (1690–1761), who married *Thomas Addison* (1679–1727); Anne (1724). CHILDREN. SONS: Richard (?–1732), who married Elinor, daughter of *Thomas Addison* (1679–1727); Walter (ca. 1692–1734), who married Susannah, daughter of Clement Brooke. DAUGHTERS: Lucy (1688–1770), who married *Thomas Brooke* (1683–1744); Eleanor (1690–1761), who married *Thomas Addison* (1679–1727); Anne (1694–1759), who married first, Francis Wilkinson, and second, *Thomas Trueman Greenfield* (1682–1733); Rebecca (1696–1737), who married *Daniel Dulany* (1685–1753); Elizabeth, who married first, Thomas Jennings, and second, Humphrey Batt; and Mary. **PRIVATE CAREER.** EDUCATION: literate; probably well educated. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Anglican, All Saints' Parish, Calvert County; wife was a Quaker. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** second generation burgess; his family was well established before 1689 and his position was further strengthened through important marriages of his brothers and sisters and his own children. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: merchant; planter. **PUBLIC CAREER.** LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Calvert County, 1696–

1697 (elected to the 7th session of the 1694–1697 Assembly; Accounts 7, 8), 1697/98–1700 (Aggrievances 2, 3; Elections and Privileges 3), 1701–1704, 1708A (Elections and Privileges), 1708B–1710 (Elections and Privileges 1–3, chairman; Aggrievances 1–3, chairman; died before the 4th session of the 1708B–1711 Assembly). LOCAL OFFICES: justice, Calvert County, 1694–1698, 1699–1711 (quorum, 1696–1698, 1699–1711; president, 1699–1711); All Saints' Parish Vestry, Calvert County, 1693–1711. MILITARY SERVICE: captain, 1689; major, 1695–1702; lt. colonel, 1702–1706; colonel, 1706–1711. STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES: opposed Revolution of Protestant Associators in 1689; proprietary loyalties prevented him from receiving appointments to public office until governorship of *Francis Nicholson* (1655–1727/28); investigated in 1698 for charges of Jacobite tendencies. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: at least 3,500 acres (of which 700 acres were probably his wife's dowry, and 200 acres inherited from her father) in Anne Arundel, Baltimore, and Calvert counties. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** DIED: will probated June 4, 1711, in Calvert County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £1,612.5.8 (including 19 slaves and a sloop); FB, £1,439.2.8. **LAND:** more than 2,600 acres in Anne Arundel, Baltimore, and Calvert counties.

SMITH, WALTER (ca. 1693–1748). BORN: ca. 1693, near St. Leonard's Creek, Calvert County; second son. NATIVE: third generation. RESIDED: near St. Leonard's Creek, St. Leonard's Hundred, Calvert County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** FATHER: Capt. Richard Smith (?–1714), son of *Richard Smith* (?–ca. 1690). Capt. Smith married first, Elizabeth, daughter of *Robert Brooke* (1602–1655). MOTHER: Barbara (?–by 1697), widow of *John Rousby* (?–1685/86), daughter of *Henry Morgan* (ca. 1616–1663). Barbara was the stepdaughter of *Jonathan Sybray* (?–1684). STEPMOTHER: Maria Johanna Somerset, widow of Col. (first name unknown) Lowther. UNCLE: *Walter Smith* (?–1711). HALF BROTHERS: Richard, who married Elizabeth, daughter of *Francis Hutchins* (?–1698); Charles S. (1698–1738); and *John Rousby* (1685–1744). SISTERS: Frances (by 1698–by 1714); Susanna (by 1698–by 1714); Barbara (1693–1764), who married first, *Thomas Holdsworth* (ca. 1692–1718), and second, *Benjamin Mackall* (1675–1761). HALF SISTERS: Ann; Elizabeth; Gertrude Rousby; and Elizabeth Rousby (1682–1740), who married Richard Bennett (1667–1749), son of *Richard Bennett* (ca. 1639–1667). FIRST COUSINS: Rebecca
