

session of the 1725–1727 Assembly). **OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFICES:** Treasurer of the Western Shore, 1700–1736; justice, Provincial Court, 1705–1707, 1712–1725 (chief justice, 1716–1725); Council, 1707/8–1725. **LOCAL OFFICES:** justice, Anne Arundel County, 1692–1701 (quorum, 1692–1701); sheriff, Anne Arundel County, 1696 (refused to serve); St. Anne's Parish Vestry, 1705, 1712–1715. **MILITARY SERVICE:** Lt. colonel, 1714–at least 1722. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** at least 1,000 acres; probably possessed over 3,000 acres by 1706. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** **DIED:** on June 23, 1736, in Anne Arundel County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £1,362.14.9 gold, £2,623.2.7 current money, £40.3.4 sterling, and 23,509 pounds of tobacco (including 33 slaves and over 106 oz. plate); FB, £568.5.9 gold, £2,237.7.8 current money, £10.16.5 sterling, and 19,717 pounds of tobacco before payment of legacies and distribution to heirs. **LAND:** over 3,000 acres.

**YOUNG, WILLIAM** (?–1732/33). **BORN:** in Calvert County; eldest son. **NATIVE:** at least third generation. **RESIDED:** at “Youngs Attempt,” Calvert County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** **FATHER:** George Young (?–1718), probably the son of (first name unknown) and wife Thomasine, who married second, Henry Kent (?–1677). **MOTHER:** Elizabeth. **BROTHERS:** John; Francis; Henry (ca. 1687–1731), who married first, Mary, second, Anne, and third, Elizabeth; Benjamin, who married Mary; and George, Jr. (?–1718). **SISTERS:** Sarah, who married (first name unknown) Smith; Anne, who married in 1704 James Demillion; Mary, who married (first name unknown) Ben-

nett; Grace, who married (first name unknown) Miller; Ellinor, who married Thomas Hillarey (ca. 1686–1728/29); and Elizabeth, who married (first name unknown) Swan. **OTHER KINSHIP:** great-grandfather, probably *William Parker* (?–1673/74). **MARRIED** ca. 1705 Rebecca, daughter of Samuel Bourne (?–ca. 1693), Gent., of Patuxent River, Calvert County, son of Thomas Bourne (?–1704) of Calvert County and London, a Quaker, and his wife Elizabeth, who was the widow of Thomas Billingsley (?–1673/74). Rebecca's brothers were Samuel; Thomas (?–1722), who married Elizabeth. Her half brother was Thomas Billingsley. Her half sisters were Sarah Billingsley, who married (first name unknown) Harris; Mary Billingsley, who married (first name unknown) Howell; and Elizabeth Billingsley. **CHILDREN.** **SONS:** Samuel (ca. 1706–?); George (ca. 1709–?); and William (1711–?). **DAUGHTER:** Elizabeth (1712/13–?). **PRIVATE CAREER.** **EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Protestant. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Mr., by 1721; Gent., by 1722. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter. **PUBLIC CAREER.** **LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Calvert County, 1716–1718, 1722–1724. **LOCAL OFFICES:** justice, Calvert County, appointed 1724, 1727, 1728, 1732 (quorum, 1727–1728, 1732); sheriff, Calvert County, 1729–1732. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** probably 250 acres in Calvert County (probably 100 acres as gift from father, 150 acres by purchase). **WEALTH AT DEATH.** **DIED:** administration bond dated March 17, 1732/33, in Calvert County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £429.12.11 current money (including 10 slaves, 1 servant, and books); FB, estate overpaid £19.5.7 current money. **LAND:** probably 250 acres in Calvert County.
