

1 DR. BARD: Would it be fair to say that a
2 vote Aye is a vote in favor of the language that approximates
3 in this respect the present Constitution?

4 THE CHAIRMAN: That is correct. Are we com-
5 pletely clear about this? Any question? A vote of Aye
6 is a vote in favor of revised draft, old language, present
7 Declaration, Page 2, and first four lines of Page 3. A
8 vote No approves and is for the Committee draft which con-
9 sists of only three lines and the second paragraph on Page
10 3.

11 All those in favor, we are talking about
12 Section 1 now, all those in favor, please signify by a
13 show of hands. This is a vote in favor of the old
14 language on Pages 2 and top of 3. A show of hands, please.
15 Contrary, a show of hands. The motion is lost, 8 to 15
16 and that means that in the Report the Committee draft of
17 three lines will appear and the other will appear as an
18 alternate. Now, let us go to Section 2, a vote of Aye
19 will be a vote in favor of the fourth paragraph on that
20 page, the next to the last paragraph opposite appears the
21 references to Articles 13 and 40. That is the old
