

1 THE CHAIRMAN: That I would think would be  
2 feasible. Mrs. Bothe? Excuse me a minute. Mr. Haile  
3 hasn't finished.

4 MR. HAILE: And, under that statute, we've im-  
5 posed six or seven special taxes which we've had no diffi-  
6 culty in collecting.

7 MR. BOTHE: To get to the point Mr. Eney made  
8 on the floor, I would make a motion that the sentence of  
9 Section (b), and I'm not again trying to reword it, A  
10 county shall have such powers as granted it by this Con-  
11 stitution or by law and by the General Assembly, and let  
12 that be the substance of what is now Section 11 and 2.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Hoff, I didn't mean by my com-  
14 ment to cut off your comment or any motion.

15 MR. HOFF: I was wondering whether it would be  
16 more difficult to spell out the affirmative powers of a  
17 county or to spell out the denial of powers. I don't know.

18 THE CHAIRMAN: Is there a second to Mrs. Bothe's  
19 motion?

20 DR. BARD: Seconded.

21 MR. CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, I don't want to
