

1 can as well as not decide to meet in executive session and  
2 in which case not keep its record, and then just meet in  
3 regular open public session whenever it desires to for  
4 five or ten minutes and ratify everything that is done  
5 in five minutes' time that it may have done in executive  
6 session over a period of months somewhat defeats the whole  
7 idea of having any record at all, and this is one of the  
8 problems that developed in Rhode Island that ought to  
9 be considered and some recommendation made on, in the  
10 nature of rules that really aren't sufficiently covered  
11 by Roberts Rules of Order or in fact, by the Rules of  
12 the House and Senate of the State Legislature.

13 It ought to be thought out in advance insofar  
14 as what is desirable and some recommendations prepared  
15 because of the peculiarities of the Convention are such  
16 that there should be some distinction between their rules  
17 and organization from what normally exists for just the  
18 State Legislature or some other legislative body that  
19 one might find some procedures used by such groups.
