

1 DR. MICHENER: You mean applicable to all  
2 Counties or all Counties of its class?

3 MR. CLAGETT: That is correct.

4 THE CHAIRMAN: In the last sentence.

5 MR. CLAGETT: It is in there?

6 THE CHAIRMAN: After the words, public general  
7 law, at the very end of the Section, you should have,  
8 applicable to other Counties in its class.

9 MRS. FREEDLANDER: We have that in our copy.

10 DR. BARD: No, you don't.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: But again, let's pick that up.  
12 That is a change that is a matter of phraseology.

13 MR. CLAGETT: No Counties shall be exempt from  
14 any public general law.

15 THE CHAIRMAN: Applicable to other Counties in  
16 its class.

17 MR. CLAGETT: If we define general public  
18 law, why doesn't it include that?

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Read the sentence again, Hal,  
20 and you will see it is necessary. No County shall be  
21 exempt from any public general law. You don't mean that.
