

1 THE CHAIRMAN: But you do not mean to preclude  
2 the Legislature from creating a regional government simul-  
3 taneously with the creation of the region.

4 MR. CLAGETT: I don't think that's implicit in  
5 the use of the word after.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: That serves to Mr. Case's comment,  
7 and I think it's well taken.

8 MR. CLAGETT: I don't think it's necessary.

9 DR. BURDETTE: You mean with and after the crea-  
10 tion.

11 MR. CLAGETT: Upon has a degree of mandatory to  
12 it which I'm not willing to accept.

13 MR. CASE: I just think it's the wrong word.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Let me make this suggestion,  
15 again without --

16 MR. CLAGETT: On or after.

17 THE CHAIRMAN: Without suggesting that this be  
18 the precise language, the thought that you have is that the  
19 representative government may be established effective upon  
20 the creation of the regions.

21 MR. CLAGETT: That's right.
