7 are out of order. I agree with Mr. Gentry, we voted  
8 on this last time. If we consider it, we will have  
9 to have a two-thirds vote.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: We are not operating under  
11 rules that every vote we take is necessarily a final  
12 vote. I do want to suggest to you that we can't make  
13 progress if we re-examine every question. I think that  
14 under the present circumstances we will save time in  
15 the long-run by taking a vote on this question and hope-  
16 fully end it.
